Often we pass from a feeling of slight emotion to one of great emotion because we allow ourselves to "**cook up**" the emotion. Someone offends us, and we ponder over it too long. We magnify it in our minds until it has ceased being something trivial and has become a thing of tremendous importance. This is usually quite unnecessary. We ought to realize the folly of allowing emotions to accumulate until they reach dangerous proportions.

Habit is involved in this, too. If we want to and if we think about it, we can form a habit of passing over emotion-arousing situations lightly, or we can form the habit of building them up. Because we are forming the habit of "shrugging our shoulders" to insults, real or imaginary, we are controlling our emotions. We are keeping them from accumulating to dangerous points.

Animals have a great range of eating habits. Some animals, such as chickens, rats, pigs, bears and human beings, eat both animal and vegetable foods. Such animals are called omnivores (eaters of everything). Lions and tigers live almost entirely on meat. They are called carnivores (eaters of meat).
